Describing differences in vocal timbre (due to age), which lead to different interpretations

The young man might be depressed. He is a calm person at times who might get angry once in a while. The old man is a sweet, kind man explaining his past.

The old man singing the same song doesn't sound so angry like the younger man, but he does sound sad. The older man sounds very experienced.

The younger singer sounds like he is expressing the changing of people he thought he knew, while the older man is singing of people actually leaving and dying.

Due to the age difference, in a way the version by the old mad at the end of his life in his 70s seems more valid and even more nostalgic, because the old man had had more experience while the young one still has life to live and get out of his agony. But the old man is probably going to die feeling alone, as the song expresses.

While both seem to be talking about the same thing they each give off a different feeling towards it. The first version sounds as if he doesn't realize what he has done wrong. The second version knows what he's done and has come to terms with his demons.
